BCoS Cognitive Screen

BCoS is a new test instrument developed to screen patients for cognitive problems following different kinds of brain damage, including stroke, head injury, carbon monoxide poisoning, and degenerative change.

It provides a novel 'cognitive profile' across a range of cognitive processes within a one-hour testing session that will indicate whether a patient has a clinical impairment (related to norms) in five primary domains of cognition: attention and executive function, language, memory, number skills, and praxis and action.
